Therefore Community College degree holders who meet the General Education requirements may require additional credits to meet the 120 credit hour graduation minimum. **(AS=Associate degree)**

At least 12 hours in the concentration must be taken at Old Dominion University. A maximum of three credit hours from FR/GER/SPAN 311 or FR/GER/SPAN 312W may count towards a minor.
